1. INTRODUCTION – WELCOME

Dear friends,

It is with great pleasure that I welcome you once again to the Cyprus Rally – round 3 of the 2009 FIA World Rally Championship.

It's great to be back in the WRC. And as you will see when our new and exciting event gets underway, we've been busy. Hosting two FIA Championship rounds in 2007 and in 2008 has certainly kept us on our toes and leaves us better prepared than ever to craft a truly exceptional WRC event for 2009.

Along with new routes, a new Service Park and more, we're also setting a precedent and launching a WRC first here in 2009. After careful consideration, the organisers of the Cyprus Rally, the Cyprus Automobile Association (CAA), have decided to take advantage of the WRC commission ruling that allows events to incorporate alternate surfaces. The introduction of new challenges is always exciting in motorsport and fans and competitors alike are already trying to assess how this new approach will change the event. Certainly it is a new challenge for the crews and the organisers, but one that is sure to take this already exciting event from strength to strength. One major advantage of the new format is that it will also mean minimal double-use of gravel stages.

Organisers of other WRC events around the globe have already shown interest in adopting the mixed-surface approach for their events and some have already been in contact with the organisers to see how the CAA deals with the challenge.

As well as welcoming the top WRC teams, the 2009 Cyprus Rally will also be one of four events rewarding points for the Junior and Production WRC championships in 2009 and the news that a third of the event is to be run on asphalt will no doubt be welcome news to those crews, especially to drivers tackling the Rally in 2-wheel-drive vehicles.

Once again our event will be based around the lively coastal resort of Limassol, on the island's south coast. The perfect place to combine rallying with a holiday in the sunshine, Limassol is a fun and friendly town with an abundance of restaurants, bars and cafes.

Located close to the seafront, the new Service Park will be spacious, easily accessible, and laid out in accordance with the FIA's preferred 'outer hub' format. The Rally HQ will be located close by at the Four Seasons Hotel.

We're very proud to be returning to the WRC and invite you to join us for the Ceremonial Start of the event which will be held in Limassol on Thursday 12th March. We look forward to welcoming you to the Cyprus Rally in 2009.

5. SERVICE PARK

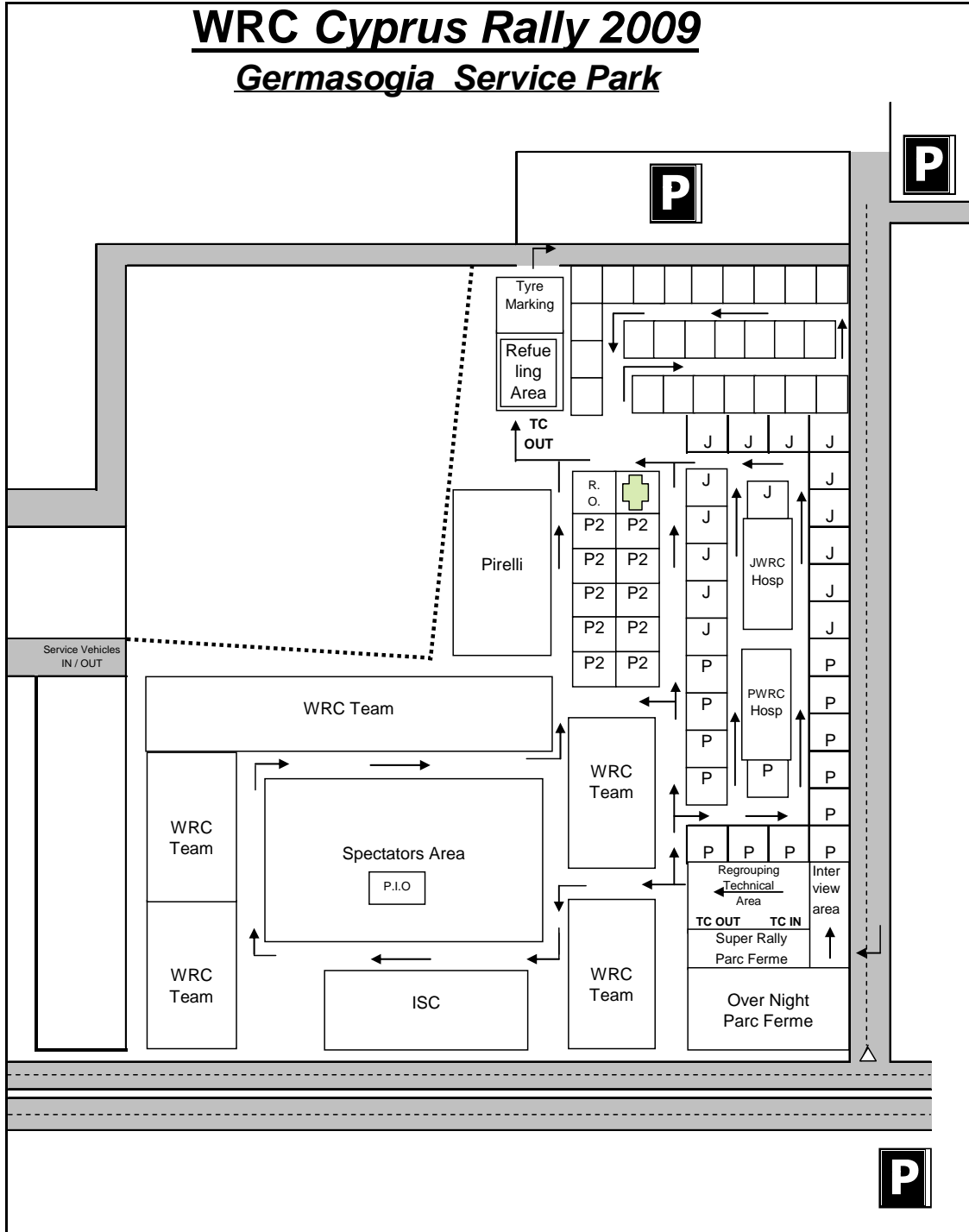
5.1. INFORMATION ABOUT THE SERVICE PARK

- 5.1.1. The Service Park will be located on the seafront in Limassol close to the headquarters.
- 5.1.2. During the rally servicing is allowed only in the service park, as defined in the FIA General Prescriptions for Rallies. This service park is marked in the road book and the maps of the rally. Manufacturers entered in the FIA World Rally Championship will have a designated area in the service park according to the recommendations of the FIA. The teams may bring their auxiliary vehicles into the service park, as long as they can park within their designated area. Otherwise these vehicles will have to be taken to the auxiliary parking adjacent to the service park.
- 5.1.3. Service and auxiliary plates will be distributed during the material collection.
- 5.1.4. The organizers have made provision for the setting up of the paddock from the 8.03.2009 for the manufacturers and the foreign teams.

5.2. FACILITIES AT THE SERVICE PARK

- 5.2.1. Facilities available to all competitors / tyre manufacturers:
- General security
 - General lighting
 - Public toilets
 - Water: competitors should provide their own pipes to access this service.
 - Waste collection
 - Waste oil tank

1. A formal request for accreditation, written on the publication's official letterhead, signed by a Director of the publication or the Editor. Requests signed by clerical staff will not be accepted
2. A completed Accreditation Form
3. Written confirmation of the publication's frequency and circulation figures
4. An original copy of the publication
5. Examples of published material from previous WRC Cyprus Rallies
6. A photocopy of the National Press Card(s) where applicable of the representatives who will be attending the Cyprus Rally
7. Requests from freelancers must be accompanied by copies of their published work during the last 12 months, specifying the names of the publications / newspapers in which the work has been published.

Items 3 and 4 do not apply to major international press agencies. Item 5 does not apply to publications applying for the first time.

Under no circumstances will Advertising, Pr and Marketing agencies, together with sponsor representatives' be eligible for accreditation

INFORMATION FOR ACCREDITATION APPLICATIONS

1. A maximum of three representatives per organization will be considered for accreditation. A separate application form should be submitted for each person to be accredited and all documentation included.
2. The application must be received by the due date stated.
3. The publication must have a circulation size and quality that satisfies the criteria of the FIA
4. The publication must be on sale to the general public via retail outlets, (trade or internal company magazines will normally not be accredited) However, at the sole discretion of the FIA and where the quality and circulation criteria justify their consideration, such magazines may be eligible for accreditation on a case by case basis.
5. Photographers must follow the same criteria. Publications or agencies applying for a single round must supply evidence of independent coverage of a minimum of 15 pictures per pass at each event they have been accredited for in the previous years Championship.
6. Photo agencies must be able to prove that pictures have been regularly sold to publications matching the FIA criteria.
7. The number of photographers' media passes issued for the national media will not exceed 12. Should there be more, a pool system is recommended.

Photographers not complying with the above (e.g., commercial photographers) must apply for accreditation to **ISC Accreditation Service**

When applications have been approved, a letter or email confirming the successful accreditation will be sent to the applicant(s), together with the Liability Waiver.

During accreditation at the Cyprus Rally, no passes will be handed out without the Letter of Confirmation and the Liability Waiver (which should be signed by the same person that signed the application form), being produced.

10. TWO WAY RADIO

10.1. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Radio transmitters are subject to licensing. The Organizers have made the necessary applications and a number of frequencies are available for the competitors use. Please inform us the soonest of your existing radio frequencies in order to check if these are available for use.

Bear in mind that throughout the rally, the use of frequencies for amateur radio is prohibited. At the pre-event scrutineering, the radio transmitters and the licenses will be inspected. Radio transmitters in aircraft will be inspected too. The use of radio transmitters will be monitored throughout the rally. Unlicensed use or use outside the terms of a license of a radio transmitter may lead to prohibition of the use of the radio transmitter.

11. FUEL

11.1. FUEL/REFUELLING REGULATIONS

The use of FIA fuel is compulsory for **all priority drivers**.

FIA fuel, as provided by the FIA appointed supplier, must be used by all Priority drivers Non-priority drivers may use commercially available pump fuel dispenses from pumps at filling stations marked in the road-book.

11.1.2. Cars of priority drivers must be fitted with FIA fuel sample couplings, although the FIA reserves the right to check the fuel of any competitor. All competitors are required to fit refuel couplings, except non priority drivers using a car which retains the standard tank.

11.1.3. The FIA reserves the right, at all times and without having to state the reasons, to replace the FIA fuel with another fuel conforming to the Sporting Code (Appendix J.)

14. IMPORT OF VEHICLES AND CUSTOMS

The ATA carnet is not a requirement for bringing your equipment into Cyprus. If you already have one it is useful.

The Organizers arranged with the Chief of Customs for the following procedure:

1. A list of all equipment carried in each van or truck, signed and stamped by your company must be brought by the driver or other accompanying person. Copy of this list should be faxed to the organizers beforehand.
2. Photocopy of the passport of each driver of each vehicle, and photocopy of each vehicle's logbook should also be faxed.
3. In order for a car to be released from customs, a written and signed authorization by the vehicle owner, naming the driver authorized to import the car, must be presented. If the owner is a company the authorization should also bear the company's stamp.
4. Upon arrival, random checks shall be carried out by customs officers to ascertain that the items in the trucks are actually on the respective lists.
5. The same procedure shall be followed on departure so as to verify that all items imported are actually exported even if they are damaged.
6. We shall make arrangements for a clearing agent to be at the port in order to expedite procedures.

16. GENERAL FACTS

Cyprus is the third largest island in the Mediterranean after Sicily and Sardinia. It covers an area of 9251 square kilometres and the main mountain range is the Troodos range with its highest peak, Mount Olympus, at 1921 metres. The population numbers just less than one million and the main language is Greek but English is very widely spoken.

There are four main towns: Nicosia (Lefkosia), the capital, Larnaca (Larnaka), Limassol (Lemesos) and Paphos (Pafos). The airports are at Larnaca and Paphos and modern motorways link all the main towns. The seaport is at Limassol.

CLIMATE

Cyprus has an intense Mediterranean climate, with long dry summers and mild winters. The March mean daytime temperature on the coast is 19.4°C with 10.0°C at night. The temperatures in the hills are 12.8°C and 4.4°C. The weather forecast can be found on the Internet at www.cyprus-weather.com

TIME ZONE

Cyprus time is GMT+2 in winter, which is from the last Sunday in October to the last Sunday in March. Summer time is GMT +3.

CURRENCY AND BANKING

The currency is the Euro (€).

There are no restrictions on the import or export of either local or foreign currency.

Banks operate from Monday to Friday from 0830 to 1230. They do not open on Saturdays.

Banks in the main tourist areas provide an afternoon tourist service and most banks have ATMs, which accept the majority of major credit and bankcards. A number of automatic currency exchange machines operate on a 24-hour basis in major town centres and main tourist resorts.

Hotels, large shops, restaurants etc. usually accept travellers' cheques and major credit cards

ELECTRICITY

The electricity supply is 240 volts AC 50Hz. Sockets are 13amp, square pin. Adapters are available on request at most hotel reception desks and they can be purchased from supermarkets, grocery shops etc.

WATER

It is safe to drink tap water in Cyprus, as there are no water-borne diseases. However, due to the climate, Cyprus has severe water shortages and it is important not to waste water.

DRIVING IN CYPRUS

Visitors to Cyprus need a valid national or international driving licence, provided it is valid for the class of vehicle they wish to drive. To hire a car, the driver must be over 25 years of age and have held a valid national/international licence for at least three years.

FUEL

Petrol, diesel and unleaded petrol are freely available at EKO, Mobil, Esso, Lina, Petrolina and Agip stations. Petrol is sold by the litre. Petrol stations are open at the following times:

Monday to Friday:	0600 – 1900
Tuesday:	0600 – 1400 in the Limassol, Larnaca and Paphos Districts. Stations are open all day in the Nicosia District.
Wednesday:	0600 – 1400 in the Nicosia District only. Stations are open all day in the other districts.
Saturday:	0600 – 1500.

All petrol stations are closed on Sundays, but most stations have fuel vending machines, which accept bank notes and credit cards. Vending machines operate during non-working hours and the instructions are in English.

Mini guide for drivers

Traffic moves on the left hand-side of the road.

The maximum speed limit on the motorways is 100 km/h and the minimum is 65 km/h. On all other roads, the maximum speed limit is 80 km/h. In built-up areas the speed limit is 50km/h, unless otherwise indicated.

The use of **front and rear seat belts** is compulsory.

Crash helmets must be worn on all motorbikes and scooters.

It is illegal to use a **hand-held mobile phone** while driving. It is legal to use a hands-free unit.

Driving with an **alcohol level** above 22 milligrams per 100 millilitres of breath is an offence.

Rush hours in the towns are approximately between 0730 and 0800 and between 1300 and 1330 and in the late afternoon

FOOD AND WINE

Food-lovers will appreciate Cypriot cuisine, as it consists of many varied dishes and flavours. Some specialities are favourites with visitors to the island.

Meze – a collection of over 20 different appetisers and savoury dishes. This is a meal not to be hurried.

Kebab (or souvlaki in Greek) – small chunks of charcoal grilled pork or chicken, served in pitta bread with salad.

Souvla – large chunks of charcoal grilled lamb, served with salad and roast potatoes.

Stifado – beef or hare, cooked in wine, vinegar, onions and tomatoes.

There is a great variety of Cyprus wine: red, white and rose. Four brands of beer: KEO, Carlsberg, Leon and 5, are brewed on the island. Cyprus is famous for the Brandy Sour, which is made from Cyprus brandy, lemon juice, angostura bitters, soda water and ice.
